Survey to Legal Profession – shaping the future

Law Society Library - Subject Guides (New – Probate, Wills & Succession)

The Library launched Law Society Subject Guides for <u>Probate, Wills & Succession</u> in March. These Subject Guides are a new member service highlighting subject specific resources and information in different areas of law. They are an excellent one-stop-shop to help you keep informed, improve your knowledge or access recommended resources in a particular area of practice. Previous guides focused on <u>Conveyancing</u> and <u>Employment Law</u>.

Members and trainees can access relevant precedents, practice notes, books, eBooks, journal articles, case law and legislation via the <u>Subject Guides</u>. Every month the library will circulate a new Subject Guide through the LawWatch newsletter. Mental health support to reach your optimal potential

Courts Service booking system

Following a pilot project and a subsequent rollout to two additional offices - the Supreme Court Office and the Cork Court Office (Washington Street) – the Courts Service are now planning for a wider rollout nationwide, throughout 2023. As you may be aware, this project involves the introduction of an appointment booking service that allows the public to make an appointment to visit a Courts Service office, at a time and date that suits them. Updates will continue as additional phases of this project are delivered.

In the meantime, due to the volume of business dealt with in the Dublin Civil Combined Offices, the <u>appointment booking system</u> is going live in these offices **from 3 April 2023**.
